

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

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ROBIN AND HER MISFITS

Even though my novels *Tink and Wendy* and *Robin and Her Misfits* are not parts of a series in the traditional sense, in many ways, those two books are linked for me. After I finished writing *Tink and Wendy* and started thinking about my next novel, I knew I wanted to continue exploring the idea of the queer reimagining—a complete rethinking of a classic tale that centered on what I noticed about our contemporary society and had queer characters. This time, though, I wanted to focus on sort of the opposite of *Tink and Wendy*—which has a very lonely protagonist, Tink, who is thinking back on her regrets from the past and telling the repercussions of her choices on the present—to create a queer girl gang of found family that was led by a reimagining of Robin Hood.

I sort of pictured *Robin and Her Misfits* as a queer girl cross between the classic *Robin Hood* story ("steal from the rich, give to the poor") and *The Fast and The Furious*. You can see the influence of that movie franchise most in the car chases and truck heists throughout *Robin and Her Misfits*. The Misfits' motto is "Steal from the rich, give to ourselves"—until they realize that they want to use their skills to do more good for their community.

One thing I emphasize about my books is that the characters are not just queer; rather, the structures of the books are also queered in order to add additional meanings to the stories. I have always been someone who, like Tink and Robin, likes to push the envelope, and I don't want to just stick queer characters in a traditional love plot with a traditional structure. Rather, I want to use the way the books are told—in this case, with sections from each Misfit, moving forward in time to see them as new adults and then adults—to show their growth and demonstrate how deep their bond is. Found family is family.

After I wrote the book, it ended up sitting on my computer, gathering digital dust. Then, during an event in Tuscaloosa at which I talked up how much I love Three Rooms Press, the publisher of *Tink and Wendy*, someone asked me about whether I would do another reimagining. I said that I actually already had one—little did I know that Kat Georges and Peter Carlaftes from Three Rooms Press were watching virtually, and afterward, they emailed to ask whether I would consider sending them *Robin and Her Misfits*. The rest is history!

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
